“I Will Be With You”  
Exodus 3:12

## CONNECT

1. Recall an event in your life where you felt like you were “standing on holy ground.” What was sacred about that moment?  
\*\*Read Exodus 3:1-12

## ENGAGE

Several years before, Moses had fled in fear for his life from Egypt to Midian. God has just revealed himself to Moses at the burning bush on Mount Horeb telling him to return to Egypt and lead his fellow Israelites out of their bondage.

\*\*Read Exodus 4:1-17

1. What three objections does Moses raise here? What do they sound like to you; False issues? Legitimate ones? True humility? Stubborn resistance?
2. How does God respond to each? What do his signs look like to you; hocus-pocus? Irrefutable evidence? Miracles which need an interpreter?
3. Why is God so angry (vs. 13-14)? Why do you think God deals with Moses' final objection as he does? Is God taking back part of the job he gave to Moses? Or assuring him success with Plan B? Why does he involve Aaron?
4. When has God reassured you of his presence and power?
  - (a) At the outset of your spiritual life?
  - (b) When you took some specific calling?
  - (c) Making a tough decision?
  - (d) Just last week? (Explain)

## APPLY

1. What concerns do you still have about doing God's will or following God's lead? What do you hear God saying to you about your concerns?
2. Who has been an “Aaron” in your life?
